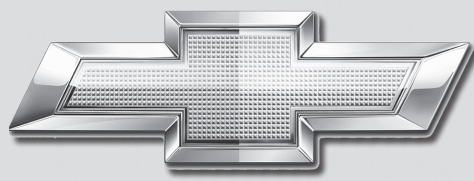

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

DEFAULT - Failure to fulfill an obligation to make payments when due to a lender.

ENCUMBRANCE - A right attached to the property of another that may lessen its value, such as a lien, mortgage or easement.

FORECLOSURE - The legal process of terminating an owner's interest in property, usually as the result of a default under a mortgage.

Foreclosure may be accomplished by order of a court or by the statutory process known as foreclosure by advertisement, also known as a power of sale foreclosure.

LIEN - A legal claim asserted against the property of another, usually as security for a debt or obligation.

MORTGAGE - A lien granted by the owner of property to provide security for a debt or obligation.

POWER OF SALE - A clause commonly written into a mortgage authorizing the mortgagee to advertise and sell the property by event or default. The process is governed by statute, but is supervised by any court.

PROBATE - The court procedure in which a decedent's liabilities are settled and his/her assets are distributed to his/her heirs.

PUBLIC NOTICE - Notice given to the public or persons affected by regarding certain types of legal proceedings, usually by placing in a newspaper or general circulation. This notice is usually required in matters that concern the public.
