EXPLANATION OF MERCER COUNTY MILL LEVY VOTE

Explanation of Mercer County Mill Levy Vote

NDSU Extension operates under a shared financial partnership between NDSU and counties. The North Dakota Century Code allows counties to levy up to 4 mills to fund local NDSU Extension work. Mercer County has been funding the local Extension office through 2 mills levied specifically for Extension and up to an additional 2 mills of county general funds. By giving Mercer County the authority to levy up to 4 mills to support Extension, the proposed measure would eliminate the need for the county to use general funds. It will not result in an increase in property taxes, just a shift from using general funds to using funds specifically designated for local Extension work.

Information about NDSU Extension in Mercer County

NDSU Extension is the link between the public and our land-grant university, NDSU. Extension provides science-based education that improves the economic, health and community

conditions for North Dakotans. Our emphasis is on strengthening agriculture, stimulating communities, developing youths' potential, building strong families, and protecting the environment.

The NDSU Extension-Mercer County office consists of an agriculture and natural resources (ANR) Extension agent, a family and community (FCW) wellness Extension agent, and administrative support staff. The ANR agent offers educational programs on a variety of topics, including crop management, livestock management, horticulture and forestry, natural resource management, farm business management, pesticide issues, and farm and ranch safety. The FCW agent offers programs on healthy aging, leadership and civic engagement, parent and family education, personal and family finance, and food, nutrition and health. Both agents share leadership of the Mercer County 4-H program.
