Schlafmann explained the TLM school district thought this changes was important Deadline Monday @ 3pm to seek innovative ways to support student achievement, staff retention and the overall well-being of the school community.

> "With changing educational needs, staffing challenges, and increasing demands on both families and educators, we recognized the importance of exploring a model that could enhance learning while providing flexibility and sustainability," she explained. "We reached out to a couple districts we know have found success in the 4-day school week for guidance in beginning the process. Our goal is to ensure that we're evolving in ways that serve our students today and in the future.'

> Looking at the benefits, Schlafmann said she believes the students will be more focused and engaged in the classrooms. The change will also allow teachers additional time for planning, professional development and collaboration, which will "directly impacts the quality of education students receive."

> "It also supports better work-life balance for both staff and students, which can reduce burnout and absenteeism,' Schlafmann said. "Both students and staff will have greater flexibility for appointments and prioritize their well-being. We have built in days for Enrichment and Intervention that can give all students the opportunity to work with teachers in a small group or one-on-one setting.'

Schlafmann said many districts adopting this model have seen improvements in recruitment and retention of high-quality educators.

However, with the advantages of change, Schlafmann did acknowledge there could be disadvantages to address.

"Some families may find it difficult to arrange childcare on the fifth day," she explained. "Another challenge that is that most textbooks are developed to accommodate a five-day learning week. Like each new school year, we will continue to reflect and adjust how we teach to meet the needs of our students."

When asked about misconceptions when it comes to four-day school days, Schlafmann said she believes the biggest misunderstanding is less school days per week means less learning.

"In reality, instructional hours are restructured not reduced — to meet state requirements," Schlaf More importantly, it's about the quality, not just the quantity, of instructional time.'

With changes, comes questions, and Schlafmann said the school district is "committed to transparent communication with our community."

"This includes updates and opportunities for families to ask questions and provide feedback," she said. "We will also continue to take a close look at our data as we implement this transition to make sure our students continue to grow. Listening and responding to staff, student and community concerns is a top priority."
