NEW SALEM CITY PROCEEDINGS REGULAR MEETING Monday, June 9th, 2025, 6:30 p.m. City Auditorium

These minutes are being published subject to review and revision by the New Salem City Council.

Gaebe called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

Attendance

Minutes

The council reviewed the May city council minutes. Olson stated he was not in agreement to the statement that 16' shells could not be shot off during the fireworks display at ND Country Fest. Kautzman moved and Lausch seconded to approve the May 12th, 2025 city council minutes with the change requested by Olson. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Water & Sewer Committee Norton presented Change Order No.1 for the wastewater treatment plant sludge reproject. The change order decreases the contract by \$282,700.80. C. Goetzfridt moved and Kautzman seconded to approve the change order as presented. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Norton also presented a pay application from Fergus Power Pump for the work that was done at the lagoon in the amount of \$397,259.20. Kautzman moved and Moen seconded to approve the pay application. All voting

aye, the motion carried.

Norton stated that USDA has been instructed to limit their grants to 10% of project cost versus the previous 40% that we have been getting with the previous projects. Norton put together some other options for the council to consider for alternate funding for the next project. Moen moved and Lausch seconded to apply for a ND DOT flex fund grant for the rest of the projects, including both priority 7 and 8. All voting aye, the motion carried. If the city would be awarded a flex fund grant then we would seek additional grants/loans through the State Water Commission and State Revolving Funds.
The Priority 6 project is set

to begin next Tuesday, June 17th, with the milling of the

The council reviewed the estimates from Hz Electric for updating the power up by the water storage tank and the estimate from Northern Light Digital for the installation of 3 security cameras by the water storage reservoir After much discus-

sion no action was taken. Street Committee

Boehm stated that they have not been able to discuss the chip seal equipment with the former city work superintendant. Dane Fuchs, but will try to do so

Auditorium Committee

Margi Engelter submitted an email to the city requesting they consider making some improvements to the basement kitchen in the auditorium. Kautzman moved and C. Goetzfridt seconded to put a screen door on the back kitchen door. All voting aye, the motion carried. The council was in agreement to have Moen bring some estimates for roaster pans, a split unit a/c, and a larger 3 tub sink with sprayer to the next meet-Engelter also stated that the water pressure in the kitchen is very low, the council was in agreement to look into it.

The New Salem Civic Club was approached about donating funds to have the auditorium piano rebuilt. The Civic Club wanted to make sure the City Council would be in agreement with the work before considering the request. Kautzman moved and Moen sconded to approve the work on the piano.

Boehm presented 3 bids for having the gutters on the auditorium replaced. Kautzman moved and Lausch seconded to approve the 2 bids from M2C Construction in the amount of \$5783.50. The motion passed with 4 yes votes. P. Goetzfridt and Olson abstained.
Police Committee

The council reviewed the May police report.

Building Committee The council again discussed the mobile homes sitting on the property at 1301 N 8th Street. Davis stated that City Attorney, Scott Solem, suggested the council have a special meeting later this week to discuss the issue. Kautzman moved and C. Goetzfridt seconded to have Davis arrange a special meeting with Scott Solem as soon as possible. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Personnel Committee

The council reviewed the May city works report. Boehm stated the lagoon pump that feeds the golf course needs service or possible replacement. Boehm stated he talked with Fuchs about the pump and Fuchs suggests calling Opp Well Drilling and have them look at it. Kautzman moved and Lausch seconded to have Boehm contact Opp Well Drilling to get an estimate of the work that needs to be done. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Boehm presented 3 new estimates for a PTO mower. C. Goetzfridt moved and Kautzman seconded to approve the purchase of a 2025 Frontier mower from RDO in the amount of \$4699.00. All voting aye, the motion carried.


