Five Clean Water loans awarded

BISMARCK, N.D. -The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWS-RF) program, jointly administered by the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality and the North Dakota Public Finance Authority, awarded five loans for sanitary and storm sewer projects since March.

The city of Flasher has received a \$162,000 CWSRF loan to replace aging water meters with advanced metering to ensure accurate accounting of water use and identify potential

Other cities that received funding include Ashley, Hazelton, Surrey and West Fargo

The CWSRF program is a low interest loan program to assist communities with a wide range of water quality infrastructure projects. The current effective interest rate for CWS-RF loans is 2.0 percent for most projects. This includes a 1.5 percent interest rate plus a 0.5 percent administration fee. The U.S. EPA provides part of the CWS-RF programs' funding, which offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Clean Water Act. CWS-RF programs operate nationwide to provide funding to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our

vital water resources.
