

NEW SALEM CITY PROCEEDINGS SPECIAL MEETING Thursday, June 19th, 2025, 6:30pm

City Auditorium These minutes are being published subject to review and revision by the New Salem City Council.

Gaebe called the meeting to order at 6:30pm. Attendance

Council Mayor: Josh Gaebe. Council members present: Delton Kautzman, Perrin Goetzfridt, Bryan Moen, Sheppard Olson, Chad Goetzfridt (arrival 7:35pm) Absent: Corey Lausch Others present: Melissa Davis, Garrison Risner, Benjamin Marxen, Scott Solem,

Minutes The council reviewed the agreement with Pegasus Illumination for a fireworks show on July 11th, 2025 at ND Country Fest. Solem advised not signing the agreement and instead issuing a special event permit for the fireworks display. Davis stated that Pegasus Illuminations has gotten written permission from the NS Lions, NS Park Board, Morton County Sheriff's Department, NS Fire Department, and the NS Emergency Director and has provided proof of insurance.

Moen moved and Olson sec onded to approve the fireworks show and grant a special event permit to Pegasus Illuminations but to limit the shell size to 6" No 8, 10, 12 or 16" shells can be discharged and all conditions of the special event permit must be met. P. Goetzfridt, Moen, and Olson, voted aye, Kautzman voted nay, the motion carried.

The council discussed further action against the owners of the Arrowhead Inn for the mobile homes being stored on the property. C. Goetzfridt arrived at 7:35pm. After much discussion with city attorney, Scott Solem, C. Goetzfridt moved and Kautzman seconded to give the owners 10 days to grant authorization to the City of New Salem to hire a contractor to remove the mobile homes and dispose of them, assessing all the costs to the property or a court order will be filed against them. All voting aye, the motion carried.

C. Goetzfridt moved and P. Goetzfridt seconded to move forward with the process to reinstate municipal court in New Salem. All voting aye, the motion carried. Gaebe adjourned the meeting at 9:00pm.
