Facility Description
The reapplication is for a 2-unit lignite coal-fired steam electric power generating plant located in the NW1/4, Section 4, Township 141N, Range 83W. There are fifteen discharge points associated with the facility. Discharges include cooling water, plant process water, sanitary wastewater, storm-

water, and screen washing. All discharges, except one, are to Nelson Lake, a Class 3 lake. The one remaining discharge is to the Missouri River, a Class 1 stream. The re-application also includes the Missouri River cooling water intake for the plant subject to the requirements of section 316(b) of the Clean Water Act.
Tentative Determinations
Proposed effluent limitations and other permit conditions have been made by the Department. They assure that State Water Quality Standards and applicable provisions of the FWPCA will be protected.

All comments received by June 14, 2025 will be considered prior to finalizing the permit. If there is significant interest, a public hearing will be scheduled. Otherwise, the Department will issue the final permit within sixty (60) days of this notice.
