

Nonresidents - Restricted to species of deer described on license. No unit restrictions DEER BOW August 29 Orange clothing required of all bow hunters during regular Restricted to type of deer and unit described on license. Type of deer includes species and whether antierless or antiered (at least one visible antier). November 7 DEER GUN 12:00 noon (CT) November 23 Note exception for white-tailed deer hunters in units 4B, 4C, 4D and 4E. 16 1/2 Day Seasor Orange clothing required Restricted to white-tailed deer only and type of deer described on license. No unit restrictions. MUZZI FI OADER 12:00 noon (CT) Orange clothing required. 11-, 12- and 13-year-olds - Any antlerless deer is legal.* 14- and 15-year-olds – Any deer is legal Orange clothing required *Hunting units 4A-4F, 3B1 and 3B2 a special license is required to hunt mule deer.
