Girls place second as team Bulldogs shine at distance carnival

Bowman County made a big impression in Bismarck April 21.

The Bulldogs were competing in the annual Distance Carnival at Bismarck State College.

They were competing against Division A schools like Bismarck, Century and Legacy, in addition to Division B rivals.

Girls take second

When it was over, the girls placed second as a team to Bismarck, with the hometown team scoring 54 points. Bowman County was next with 43 points, followed by Mandan (31), Century and St. Mary's -- both tied for fourth with 23 points.

Minot was sixth (21), followed by Dickinson Trinity (16), Legacy (16), Killdeer (8) and Minot North (3) to round the ten teams competing.

Much of the Bulldogs' scoring strength came in the relay events.

Adyson Gerbig, Sophia Headley, Landyn Gerbig and Quin Andrews got together to win the 4x100 meter relay with a time of 50.65 seconds. The quartet of Charlee Blaser, Addie Umbreit, Chloe Haar and Hadyn Hlebechuk also placed fifth (54.29) in the same race.

In the 4x400 meter relay, it was the same winning foursome grabbing another win with a 4:19.12 time.

In the 4x200 meter relay, the Bulldogs took third place with Charlee Blaser, Addie Umbreit, Quin Andrews and Hadyn Hlebechuk running a 1:51.63 time.

Adyson Gerbig placed third in the 400 meters with a 1:02.74 time.

In the 800 meters, Sophia Headley was fifth, (2:21.98), while Landyn Gerbig placed 17th (2:34.13).

In the 1,600 meters, Jaylee Fischer was tenth (5:34.07), while Anna Sarsland came in 13th (5:41.76).

In the 3,00 meters, Jordyn Honeyman placed third (12:02.10) and Julie Sarsland took eighth (12:57.03).

Wanner leads boys

Bowman County finished in a tie for sixth in the team race in Bismarck with Red River, both with 17 points.

Bismarck-Century was first with 59 points, followed by Bismarck (51), Mandan (34), Legacy (26) and St. Mary's (18) in fifth.

Senior Taylor Wanner showed he was rounding into shape for the upcoming state championships by winning the 800 meters with a 1:53.61 time. It was his fastest time this season and close to his winning time in the 2024 state championship race (1:53.18). Thomas Bowman placed 18th (2:08.66) in the race.

Brayden Williams set a personal record when he placed fourth in the 400 meters (52.62 seconds). He was the only Division B runner in the race to place in the top 15.

In a 1,600 meter race loaded with Division A runners, Jonah Njos was seventh (4:23.48), followed by Noah Njos (tenth, 4:33.82) and Warner Bowman (11th, 4:34.15).
