All Work shall be substantially completed on or before **December 1, 2025**. Substantial completion includes all work items being completed except for punch list items. All Work shall be completed by June 30, 2026.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids and rebid the project until a satisfactory bid is received, to waive any informality in any bid, to hold all bids for a period not to exceed thirty-six (36) days from the date of opening bids, and to accept the bid deemed most favorable to the interest of the Owner. 
