

SPECIAL MEETING WALSH COUNTY COMMISSION 22667

July 8, 2025 - 12:30 p.m.

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session to discuss the proposed Walsh County Jall project and associated funding options. Members Present: Chair Brintnell; Commissioners Skorheim, Barta, Suda, and Houdek.

Sheriff Ron Jurgens presented the Jail Committee's recommendation to proceed with Option 2 Re-vised—a 46-bed facility estimated at \$23,687,522. He emphasized the need to act promptly due to inflation.

Commissioner Houdek voiced concern over the 0.75% sales tax increase, suggesting it be offset by \$500,000–\$800,000 in potential savings from switching dispatch to state radio. He proposed a 0.25% tax and requested more time to review cost differences.

Commissioner Skorheim moved to proceed with Plan B and authorize up to a 0.75% sales tax; seconded by Barta. Motion carried 3-2. (Brintnell, Skorheim, Barta – aye; Suda, Houdek – nav.)

Commissioners noted limited public feedback and emphasized transparency. While supporting the project, Commissioners Houdek and Suda continued to favor a lower sales tax to minimize impact on local businesses.

Sid Samuels from Construction Engineers outlined three delivery options: General Contractor, Construction Manager at Risk, and Construction Manager as Agent. He recommended the Agent model for its transparency and local contractor involvement.

Legal counsel advised that architectural services must be procured via formal RFP under North Da-kota Century Code, with cost now a factor in sele-tion. The Commission agreed to expedite selection to allow for bidding by early 2026.

The Jail Committee will continue reviewing delivery options and work to advance the project timeline Meeting adjourned.
