

# **Commissioners** Offer Clarification On A Couple Issues

At their regular monthly meeting held Wed., Sept. 10 Logan County Commissioners offered a couple of clarification points in regards to information discussed at a previous meeting.

Commissioners John Wald, and Bryan Batsch agreed with Commissioner Schumacher in her written clarifications points which were as follows:

Clarification of information (1): According to County records and the opinion of the Logan County States Attorney the jurisdiction of the road that passes through the W ½ of Section 20 in Red Lake Township does not fall within the County or the Township, nor does it fall within the definition of a 20-year established trail, but it is a private road on private property.

Clarification of information (2): Cameras and other evidence show that two culvert(s) that were recently installed in Sections 8/9 in German Township became ruined when the Road Closed signs and other measures that were put in place for the public safety purposes (by County Highway Department) were either moved or driven over by individuals who chose to ignore the warning signs.

In other road related matters Katie DeWitt, with the engineering firm KLJ, updated commissioners on the proposed project between Logan County and McIntosh County. Commission chair John Wald signed off to allow KLJ to proceed in applying for flex funding. DeWitt also offered updates on the proposed Burnstad road (paved road) which is in the works for an upgrade. Dewitt noted the wet land work has been completed and she is also working on possible flex funding for this project as well. She also informed commissioners that some existing fences may be on the road rightof-way, but for the most part should not interfere with work. Commissioners offered Dewitt the names of a couple of landowners who are willing to offer dirt/gravel along or the near the construction of the road which is projected to take place in 2028. The final project updated was the "Perry Turner" bridge and work is still proceeding.

There was no written comment nor did anyone appear during the allotted time of the budget hearing. It was agreed to have auditor Jody Kristiansen bring budget forward to the October meeting.

NDSU-Logan County employ-

ee Dustin Hammond addressed the board and noted that he and NDSU-Logan County employee Josh Becker have been meeting with teachers from across the county and that there is interest in possible job shadow type opportunities. Hammond also noted they are planning on hosting a Lead Local event on Wed., Oct. 8 at the Napoleon Country Club. The event would offer insight on developing leadership skills and parliamentary skills.

addressed Commissioners a permit fee they charge utility providers when they are upgrading or doing outdoor construction, and after discussion agreed not to make any changes and leave the fee at \$250.

Commissioners approved a pair of building permits: Gross Cattle, Donovan Gross a 150'x91" silage pad and Brian Jangula a 40'x30' pole building just out of the east side of Napoleon city limits.

A letter has been drafted regarding trees on road rights of way. Commissioners approved the letter and it will be sent to property owners who have trees growing on road rights of way.

It was agreed to access each parcel (roughly 6,000 across the county) 5 cents each for the recent budget hearing notice which was mailed to cover the cost of the process. It was also agreed not to send notices to any parcel which is assessed under \$2.00 in taxes.

Commissioners agreed to enter into a gravel lease with Adam Schumacher, just west of Napoleon, for water proofing material. They also signed other leases of which they will contract owners for their signatures. Commissioners also agreed to sell an old rusty culvert (60"x42") located at the Napoleon Shop for \$50 to Gary Schlabsz, Ashley.

It was agreed to streamline the payroll process, as many are now receiving direct deposit versus actual check and it was agreed to run payroll the last day of the month.

It was reported that Logan County will be hosting a ND Assoc. of Counties and ND County Commissioners Assoc. tour on Thurs., Oct. 16 at the courthouse. The purposed of the tour, which starts at 2:00 p.m., is to help increase communication among county officials, NDACo, and NDCCA and to hear county concerns and answer any questions the county may have about the services and programs provided by the organizations.
