Phase 1, Contract 7-24A** at the Spirit
Lake Water Resource Management Of-
fice located in St. Michael, North

and at which time they will be pub-

The scope of WORK includes fur-
nishing and installing approximately
11.6 miles of 6" - 1½" ASTM D2241
PVC gasketed joint pipe and 1" HDPE
pipe, approximately 10 services; road
crossings; connections to existing
pipelines and other related appurten-

Spirit Lake Reservation in Benson

A bid alternate will be considered

Devils Lake beats Sioux Falls West, Gretna on first day of 2025 Dakota Classic

SIoux FALLS — As recently as the first week of this month, Devils Lake batters were struggling as a collective. On Friday in Sioux Falls, they could hardly

stop hitting. As they did last year, the Devils Lake Storm A squad traveled down to southeastern South Dakota for the Dakota Classic, a round-robin tournament with four guaranteed games. They picked up more wins on Friday than

last year's team did in the entire tournament, with wins against teams from South Dakota and Nebraska. The Storm bested Sioux Falls West Post 15 in a 2-0 pitchers' duel before outlasting Gretna Post 116 in a 10-7 slugfest.

"It's nice to come down here and compete with who we think we can go compete with," Storm coach Brent Luehring said. "It's starting to click a little bit." Devils Lake (4-4) improved its winning streak to four games.

"Once one guy gets on, it just kind of sparks, and we keep going," the Storm's Brody Rainsberry said. "And I like that. We keep rolling." **Game 1: Devils Lake 2, Sioux Falls West 0** The first game was the Rainsberry show. Joining

the Storm from neighboring Nelson County this summer, he threw a complete-game shutout on 87 pitches (55 strikes). He allowed seven hits, one walk and one hit batsman. "I was really trying to hit the outside corner, hit See CLASSIC | 8

"Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in Your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them." Watching newsreels of bombings while I nursed my sore ankle reinforced

the truth of my own mortality. We are all just earthenware vessels, susceptible to injury and death. However, the Lord has redeemed those of us who have trusted Christ. We might have once been land Satan had conquered, but the Lord has redeemed us. He holds the deed, having given us His Holy Spirit as a guar-

antee of the eternal life He has promised. He brought His people back to the Promised Land to dwell in safety. He will bring us safely home to dwell with Him in eternity. Jeremiah's land purchase wasn't a waste and neither was Christ's purchase of us. My ankle will heal. There will be an end to this war between Israel
