

Hazel Krack Interview: May County: Towner City: Maza

"I was raised three miles north of Maza," Hazel says. "Grandpa settled in 1893. there When Grandfather lost the farm during Depression,

Dad bought it back from the government [in 1939]. "My dear grandfather stayed there

in the house. He had his room. Grandpa had a lot to do with my interest in history and the Bible. I just loved to go and sit and listen to him

"I can remember standing on the

wood box by the cookstove and him pointing out different places on a map of North Dakota. Also I could remember Grandpa would say it only took one word for God to create the world. One word, one three-letter word—let—and that what we needed to do is to let God do His work. [Grandpa] often would speak about the different places in the Bible it would say 'let us.'"

When Hazel was 15, in 1951, Grandpa died. "I was the one that found him. I remember his funeral. I had to wear a hat. I didn't like my hat. Everybody wore hats back then when they went to church.


"I remember we looked forward to going to the grocery store [in Maza]. That was a little grocery store there with a post office in it. And I remember going to the elevators, 'cause I helped haul the grain.

"In Maza, the neighbors were all close. They were just almost like part of a family. It's just good, solid people that work together as long as they lived, to do whatever needed to be done."

Hazel says, "I taught in a country school including two years at Mylo, a little town that's hardly there any-

where

more. And then I was preaching for 35 years. I had known from the time I was a little girl that was what was meant for me to do. I was in the ministry in South Dakota, Utah, Colorado, Nebraska, and I was back here a year, but I took care of my parents and then after they died then I moved into Cando and I've been here in the library most o' the time.

Her favorite Bible passage is "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever," found in Hebrews 13:8.


