Minutes of the Cando City Council The Cando City Council met on Tuesday,

May 20, 2025, at the Towner County Courthouse. Councilors Bjornstad, Halverson, Klingenberg, Miller and Scott were present, with Mayor Bjornstad presiding. Councilor

Olson was absent. A motion was made by Councilor Bjornstad and seconded by Councilor Miller to approve the agenda with the addition of a visitor being

Visitors & Delegations: B. Rohrich was the first visitor of the evening and inquired about the zoning regulations. She told the council that her brother and herself are looking to start a business in town that would put on classes for various types of safety training that are required for different industries, and when there are no classes they would open the rooms up for people to stay in. They have a property in mind where they would like to run their business, but Rohrich said they didn't know what the zoning regulations are. The council asked her if she and her brother could send a detailed proposal of their business. Based on the proposal, they will see if this business will be acceptable for the zoning regulations. J. Bannach was the next to speak to the council about diseased elm trees on the berm in front of her house. She told the council that she has asked many times for the trees to be taken down, but nothing has been done. Council told her talk to the Public Works Department and they will

Old Business: Brad Muscha from Moore

Engineering appeared before council via Teams to give the council members an update on the Sewer Project, the 4th Ave Water Main Replacement project and the Lead Service Line Inventory Project. Muscha started off his presentation with the Sewer Project. He told everyone that construction company BEK had started back working on the project, but due to the rain, had to shut the work down. Before they stopped working, Brad said that two valves and pipes have been put in the intersections of 5th Ave & 11th St and 5th Ave & 12th Street, and also what the plan is for manhole number three, so things can keep flowing. They are hoping to get back to work once the rain stops and will have an updated construction schedule for the council soon. A motion was made by Councilor Klingenberg and seconded by Councilor Scott to approve the fourth Contractor's Application for Payment (CAP#4) all voted aye and the motion passed. A motion to submit Reimbursement Request # 9 was made by Councilor Bjornstad and seconded by Councilor Halverson. All voted aye and the motion passed. Next was an update on the 4th Ave Water Main Replacement Project. Brad said that the contracts have been sent to Post Construction as they have their bonds in place, and the City should receive a copy of the contract to review in about a week's time. He told council that they are still working on the Owner-Engineer Agreement for Construction Phase Services and it should be available for the council to review at the June meeting. Lastly, it was said that it would be a good idea if they had a pre-construction meeting for this project. It was decided to hold this meeting in the first week of June with the date and time still to be decided. To end his presentation to the council, Muscha discussed the Lead Service Line Inventory Project. He mentioned to the council that after three rounds of door knocking, 77% of the houses in town have completed the survey, and 11 services have been found to have lead pipes. Brad said that they will be doing a fourth round of door knocking and will be in town on Thursday, May 29th be-

tween 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. New Business: A motion was made by Councilor Halverson and seconded by Councilor Scott to add Sheila Bjornstad as a signer for the city's bank accounts. All voted aye and the motion passed. The council reviewed and acknowledge the Renter's Agreement that will be signed between the City and the people who rent the Pavilion. They also acknowledge building permits that were approved for G. Porter, a change for R & J Halverson, and a letter from the State Tax Commission to administer the City of Cando's local sales, use and gross receipts taxes for 2025 - 2027 biennium. A motion

permit that was submitted from Laturnus' to sell fireworks in their usual spot. All voted aye and the motion passed. Councilor Bjornstad abstained from the vote. The conversation turned to the streets in town. The Public Works Department has made a list of ones that need repairs which will be given to the paving company for quotes. They also talked about the condition of Highway 17 at the intersection of Highway 281. The Public Works Department gave an update on what they have been working on. CC Steel was also in town to complete the cameraing of the areas that still needed to be done that were listed in the contract. They're also waiting on a new storm drain to come in, so they can repair the one that collapsed at the intersection north of the Post Office. The Free Dump Days has been rescheduled to Saturday, May 31st and Sunday, June 1st, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. There have also been some changes in the Public Works Department with Tim Goer gen being appointed Public Works Supervisor. With the change happening, a motion was made by Councilor Scott and seconded by Councilor Bjornstad to give him a two dollar per hour increase for taking on the leadership role. All voted in favor and the motion passed. The council acknowledged and accepted the contract from Advanced Business Methods for the printer. The city has been working with the State Auditor's Office on a report of the city's finances that is required for the loan forgiveness program that Cando qualified for. The city has provided all the information the Auditor's Office requested, and now are waiting for the report to be completed before starting a full audit for 2021 to Open Committee: Councilor Scott, Miller

and Klingenberg all mentioned the spots/streets that need repair. Mayor Bjornstad mentioned that he found a generator that could be used to keep the lift stations running at the Bus Barn, by Houtcooper's and down by 15th Street if the power goes out. After some discussion, they decided that they would like more information on the costs for maintenance and disconnects.
