Executive sessions are a special meeting and are held to only discuss 1) ing and are held to only discuss 1) confidential information 2) exempt information, 3) attorney consultation, and 4) negotiations strategy. There is specific wording to read for motion on executive sessions. Only that subject can be discussed in the that subject can be discussed in the session and no action can be taken. Dr. Lech reported on public comment on board policy FDF Foreign Exchange Students. The policy is specific to limit the number of students who must be residents of lamestown. who must be residents of Jamestown Public Schools. It does not allow non residents the ability to host foreign exchange students and place them in our district. The district does not receive funding for foreign exchange students. Board direction is to leave the policy for now and look at again in the future if the limit of students is not met at JPS.
