optimistic,” the association said in a Thursday news release. “It will take time to see how these commitments translate to actual sales, particularly though the Pacific Northwest export corridor, which is critical for North Dakota soybean farmers. Many of our farmers continue to face negative margins and financial pressures, so meaningful improvements will depend on consistent, long-term follow-through in the marketplace.”

Greg Amundson, a soybean farmer from Gilby and a board member of the North Dakota Corn Growers Association, said just prior to the deal being reached that he doesn’t think a trade deal will have as much impact on local markets as some

are predicting.

“The trade deal isn’t what has affected the market. What’s affected the market is there’s too much soybeans in the world,” he said.

Instead, he said the bigger impact on North Dakota soybean farmers is that the local basis, which is the futures price minus costs for things like crop transportation and the portion paid to the elevators, is improving. Amundson said he’s seen recent basis prices between 40 cents and \$1.20 — the lower the amount, the better the basis.

“There’s obviously something getting done,” he said. “The market knows something more than what the headlines know.”

Montgomery added he did recently sell soybeans for \$10 a bushel, which he said is about middle range in terms of

prices.

“We were looking at sub-\$9 to mid-\$9 range, and anytime beans are in the single digits, things get tough,” he said.

While the U.S.-China deal could help relieve some pressure on local farmers, Montgomery said the crush plants in the state have also been helping to take in a lot of the unsold crop — something he said wasn’t an option the last time soybean farmers were facing similar trade conditions.

“We had no other options; it had to leave the state,” he said. “So those crush plants really took a lot of the sting out of it.”

North Dakota has two open soybean crushing plants: one in Spiritwood and one in Casselton. A proposed crush plant in Grand Forks, Epitome Energy, has yet to break ground.

No matter how the deal

with China progresses, Montgomery and Amundson both praised the resilience of North

Dakota farmers as they face uncertain futures and unstable markets.

“We’re just chugging

through it,” Amundson said. “It kind of is what it is — you’ve just got to keep moving.”

Ruby Whitehorn arrested again, dismissed by Tennessee

After her second arrest in the last three months, Tennessee senior guard Ruby Whitehorn has been dismissed from the program, head coach Kim Caldwell announced on Sunday.

Early on Thursday, Whitehorn was reportedly stopped by campus police and charged with misdemeanor simple possession (marijuana)/casual exchange.

On Aug. 8, the Detroit native was arrested and charged with felony domestic assault and aggravated burglary. She had kicked in the front and bedroom doors of a woman’s residence, but

claimed she was attempting to recover her phone and passport from the woman, who had locked the doors to the residence.

Whitehorn was suspended at that time. On Sept. 5, she pleaded down to misdemeanors of aggravated trespassing and aggravated burglary in exchange for judicial diversion and was subsequently reinstated to the team.

Last season, the 6-foot guard averaged 11.6 points and 4.0 rebounds per game for the Lady Vols in her first year in Knoxville. She started in 28 of 34 games and helped Tennessee reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.
